

Registration and Fees

Registration is September 12, 19, 26

Deadline for payment is September 26. **Please do not wait until the last minute to register. Any registrations received after September 26 will be accepted only if space is available, and cabin selection will not be possible.**

\$100/person (age 13 and older)

\$65/person (age 3-12)

Newborn up to 3-no charge

Maximum charge of \$330 for families with dependent children

Fees include Friday and Saturday night housing and all meals from Friday dinner through Sunday brunch.

All fees are due when you turn in your registration form. However, if you need longer to pay, let us know on your form. A limited number of scholarships are available through an application process. Ask any NaCoMe committee member to help you arrange for the scholarship.

The NaCoMe committee and clergy staff reserve the right to deny registration as space and safety issues warrant.

Housing

Housing facilities at NaCoMe vary, but all are equipped with beds/bunks and with either private or dorm-style bathroom facilities. Most cabins are now fully renovated and have central heat and air. The few remaining older buildings have heaters only. Most cabins have front porches.

All NaCoMe common facilities are wheelchair accessible as are most cabins. Please tell us of any special needs and preferences on your registration form.

Provided you call by at least 10 am on Friday October 8, we will gladly change your reservation and give you a refund of the unused fees (within approximately 30 days after the camp). After 10 am Friday, refunds will not be given for late cancellations or no-shows. Please save a copy of the refund/cancellation policy on the registration form. It includes the number to call to change or cancel your reservation.

Alcohol consumption is not permitted at NaCoMe by rules of NaCoMe Retreat and Conference Center and at the request of your NaCoMe committee.

Pets are not allowed at camp.

From Memphis to NaCoMe

Take I-40 East to exit 143. Take a right off the exit ramp, and follow highway 13 to the four-way stop in Linden.

Take a left onto highway 412/100

About 2.4 miles after you cross the Buffalo River, Hwy 100 and 412 split. There is a big gas station/minimart between the split. Take Hwy 100 (fork to the left) for about 13 miles, passing through the Pleasantville community.

Look for a sign on the right that says "NaCoMe 1/10 mile."

Take a LEFT onto NaCoMe Road and follow it until you get into the camp, approximately 2 miles down.

Anticipate about 3 to 3 1/2 hours total of travel time.
